

How did Busy Bees School in Rwanda Prepare for a Safe Learning Environment?

- The school has got tanks to make sure there is enough clean water for both learners and teachers to regularly clean their hands
- Signposts are available in the school displaying information to fight COVID -19
- Appropriate information is posted across the school premises to indicate and guide everyone on how to protect themselves against the COVID-19
- The school leader has followed the guidelines provided by the Ministry of Education to prepare the school to receive students

How did Schools in Rwanda Prepare to Prevent Future Financial Crisis?

Through OI SLPD content on Financial management, school leaders in Rwanda started initiating some school projects to generate school income at their schools.

- Rise to Shine Primary schools, cooperated with financial institutions like Equity and MTN telecommunication company to deliver their services at school as a way of generating income for the school.
- Busy Bees School, decided to start growing mushrooms in their land as a way to generate income for their school.
- School leaders at Fruits of Hope School, decided to start rabbit rearing business at their school as a way of preventing future financial crisis



What did School Leaders in Rwanda do to Prevent the Spread of COVID-19?

- The school leaders at Rise and Shine Primary School trained teachers on dealing with various aspects of keeping children safe in classrooms
- The school leaders at Rise and Shine Primary School reached out to various partners and with the support of one such financial institution, they purchased necessary testing and protective equipment for classrooms
- At Oleander Primary school, teachers were trained on the preventive measures to fight COVID -19

How did School Leaders at Oleander Primary School Communicate Re-opening Plans with Parents ?

- School leaders have been calling and where possible, meeting with parents face to face to discuss re-opening plans
- School leaders compiled and shared key information including the exact names of learners who are coming back to school, registering new learners, deciding on the best ways to pay the tuition fees and the proper strategies to keep learners safe the time of school reopening
- Oleander Primary school has been able to cooperate with a local bank which will be giving tuition fees loans to parents to ease the collection of school fees and lessen the burden on parents
- School leaders have decided to hire a counselor who will provide emotional and psychological support to parents, teachers and learners
