

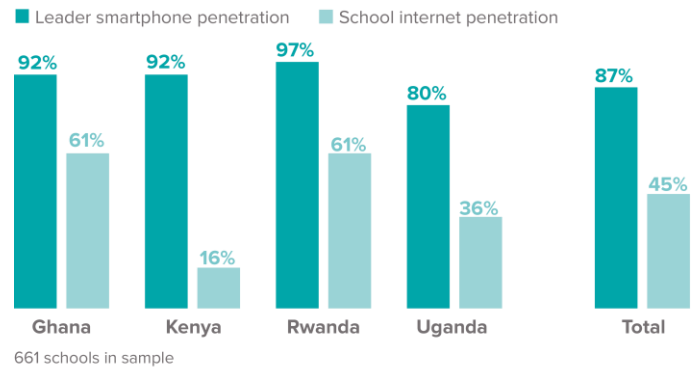
## Key Insight: Limitations to online access and learning

Connectivity rates for schools highlight the need for a **broad approach** to support learning during school closures in low tech / low resource environments.

### Key finding #1 Smartphones & Internet

School owners are largely accessible by smartphone, but schools face challenges with internet access.

### Connectivity at Schools



While **87%** of school owners participating in the Education Quality program have access to **smartphones**, only **45%** of schools have **internet access**. The cost of data also has implications on consistent access to the internet.

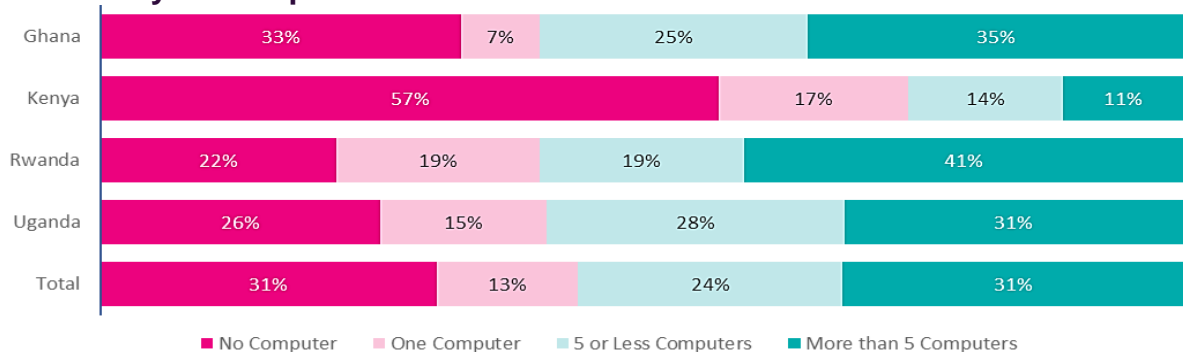


With many schools unable to pay staff during ongoing closures, some schools are reporting teachers do not have data to communicate with parents via phone to send parents learning activities for students.

### Key finding #2 – School Computers

With **44%** of schools owning **1 or fewer computers**, we can infer most learners at these schools do not have access to a computer at home. According to International Telecommunication Union, in sub-Saharan Africa, **82%** of learners do not have access to the internet.\*\*

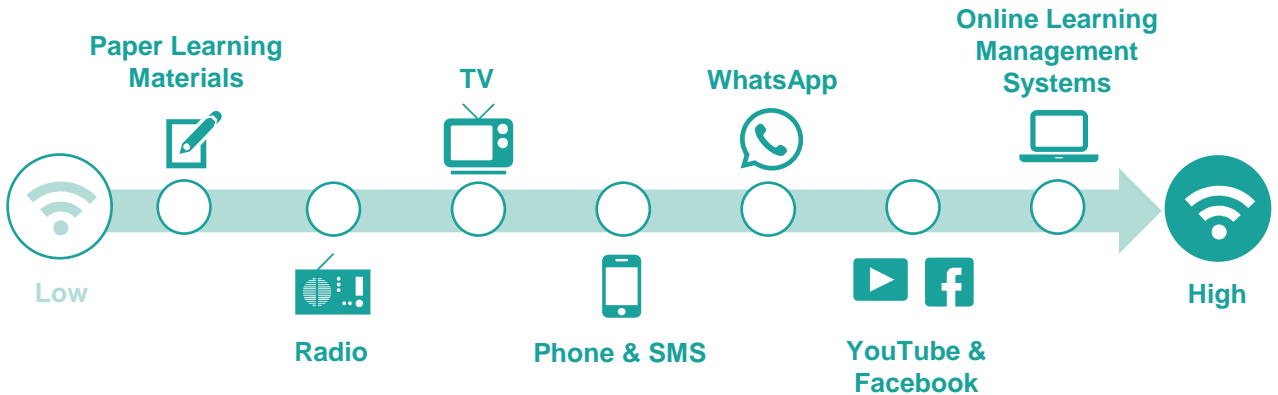

Encouraging discussion & sharing of approaches via existing Cluster WhatsApp groups.



### Facebook Lite

Publishing resources & discussion prompts to drive further sharing between school leaders.
