1 Improve Education Quality in Low-Fee Schools

Our APPROACH

The **CHALLENGE**

Low-fee schools in northern Ghana have challenges hiring and retaining qualified teachers, and school leaders often lack the range of skills they need to run a sustainable, quality school.

Our SOLUTION

- ▶ Increase teacher certification and retention
- ► Strengthen school leadership skills
- **▶** Strengthen teacher in-service training
- ► Increase adoption of MoE curricula

2 Increase Private Sector Investment in Low-Fee Schools

The **CHALLENGE**

Low-fee schools in northern Ghana have less access loans to invest in their schools than the rest of the country, and parents have less access to school fee financing, often compounded by lower levels of financial literacy.

Our SOLUTION

- Increase financial institutions' capacity to finance low-fee schools and school fees
- ► Increase blended finance approaches to unlock private capital



The **CHALLENGE**

While thousands of children attend low-fee schools in northern Ghana, the government is challenged to provide oversight and support to ensure quality education, challenged by the lack of a coherent policy framework to coordinate agencies responsible for low-fee schools.

Our SOLUTION

- Improve the policy & regulatory framework governing low-fee schools
- ► Strengthen the capacity of the government to oversee low-fee schools
- ► Increase collaboration and learning between stakeholders in the low-fee schools sector

Prioritizing Gender Equity & Social Inclusion

- ► Schools with women leaders and leaders from marginalized groups like the Fulbe will be prioritized in school selection.
- ► Teacher certification & scholarship funding will be specifically marketed with a GESI lens, ensuring equity in allocation.
- ▶ Gender responsive educational approaches are integrated in all school training content.
- ► Technical assistance for financial institutions will include recommendations for product terms that address gender and marginalized group barriers to accessing capital, and training on GESI lending approaches.
- ▶ A GESI lens will be used to inform policy recommendations and design new monitoring and oversight models to ensure consideration of implications related to gender and marginalized groups like the Fulbe.
